Spartans find Indian fence and lay claim to same

In Athens it was the Tribe on top in a 14-1 win. In Hiwassee fortunes were reversed as the Athens Academy Spartans blasted a 19-2 vengeance against the Indians. The visitors took over the scoreboard early and never looked back. The Spartans put a couple of runners on then plated them with an RBI double, 2-0. The next batter capped that with a 2-run HR blast to make it 4-0 in the top of the first. The second was more of the same for Indian starter, Trystan Drummond as the Spartans found the left field fence to their liking. After a gimme run on a passed ball at home and no one covered the plate, a Spartan waltzed home untouched, 5-1. Again, the Spartans found the fence for a 3-run blast and it was 8-0. An RBI double plated two more runs for a 10-2 lead in the second


inning. Despite pitching changes to Taylor Denton and Alan Turpin, the big Spartan bats were still smokin' in the third with a 3-run blast over center, 14-0. Billy Meier opened the bottom half with a double and

moved to second on a sac by Randy Smith. An RBI single in the gap by Matt Beni made it a 14-1 game after three full innings. In the fifth, an RBI single made it 15-1 and a 2-RBI Double made it 17-1. By the time the Tribe finally got rid

of the Spartans it was 19-1. The Indians again turned to Billy Meier who belted a double then raced home off an RBI by Randy Smith to make it the final 19-2 game. The Athens Christian game will run next week.


