County Indians' football team began practice in shoulder pads and shorts at The Refuge in Plott Town.

"It's great to be back out here with the kids," Indians' Head Coach Kyle Langford said. "We can't wait until the lights go on for real on Friday nights."

The Indians had 43 football players out on the practice field this week and Coach Langford said he pleased.

"Hey, we've got some great kids, who are very talented," he said. "We're going to have some depth."

On Monday, the signs of a new school year were even more evident as new technology equipment was being transferred from the Central Office on Lakeview to the schools.

"There's a lot of activity going on," Dr. Behrens

At least one new face is on board. Dr. Mark Stallings, a two-time Teacher of the Year in Gilmer County, who retired in the area, will teach science part-time, Dr. Behrens said.

"We're extremely lucky to have Mark on board," he said.

Also, Daniel Isaacs will step into the shoes vacated when Towns County Marching Band Director Frank McKinney retired last year.

"Daniel has been with us for a while working with Frank," Dr. Behrens said. "He knows are band and our talent and we are expecting big things from that group this year."
