David Keith Jefcoat, a native of Laurel, Miss., earned his bachelor's degree in piano performance from Brenau College in 1978 and a master of music in piano performance from the University of Georgia in 1983. His teachers have included Spanish pianist Carlos Kussrow-Corma, Austrian-American concert artist Walter Hautzig in New York, and Russian pianist Eugeny Rivkin at UGA.

Mr. Jefcoat is the director of Preparatory Music, Inc. He has taught private piano since 1975 and has consistently produced winners and alternates in piano events throughout Georgia. Since 1975 he has accompanied extensively for various choral groups, chamber ensembles, instrumentalists and vocalists in the Gainesville area. In January 2001, Mr. Jefcoat accompanied the Georgia Music Educators All-College Chorus under the baton of Sir

Anthony Goodchild of London. He is a member and founder of the Lanier Chamber Singers and has served as organist at the First United Methodist Church in Gainesville since 1993.

A native of Griffin, Priscilla Jefcoat earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in piano performance from Brenau College. She received the Master of Music and doctor of musical arts degrees in piano performance from the University of Georgia. Her teachers have included

Kussrow-Corma and Hautzig. Her doctoral studies were completed under concert artist and published author Dr. Richard Zimdars, chair of the piano department at UGA.

Dr. Jefcoat is an assistant professor of music at Brenau, where she teaches music theory and piano both at the college and preparatory levels. She is active in the Georgia Music Teachers Association and the Federated Music Clubs and is a member of the National

Honor Roll of Teachers of the National Guild of Piano Teachers. She has served at the local and state levels and has adjudicated throughout the Southeast. She currently serves as organist/music director at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Gainesville.

The Jefcoats, duet partners since 1981, have played duet piano recitals throughout the Southeast.

They have a son, a daughter and son-in-law, and three grandchildren.

Guitar summit planned at Young Harris

Young Harris College's Division of Fine Arts will host the 2009 North Georgia Guitar Summit Thursday and Friday, Nov. 13-14.

The summit is an exciting educational workshop open to all students of high school and college-level music programs as well as an opportunity for guitar music fans to experience concerts and classes presented by outstanding artists.

Events during the summit include a lecture-recital on the ancestors of the guitar, a recital by the popular Georgia Guitar Quartet and a master class by world-renowned guitar instructor John Sutherland.

Hailing from Athens, the Georgia Guitar Quartet (GGQ) has emerged as an exciting new voice in today's chamber music scene. Composed of Jason Solomon, Phil Snyder, Brian Smith and Kyle Dawkins, these four young men deliver a high-energy blend of breathtaking virtuosity and imaginative programming while taking an adventurous approach to classical music.

Borrowing from both the past and present, the GGQ draws inspiration from the ever-evolving palette of music that has influenced them: classical masters such as Bach and Brahms, experimentalists in the vein

of Cage, Bartók, and Stockhausen, and contemporary rock icons like Radiohead and Led Zeppelin.

Formed in 1996, the Quartet performs throughout the nation in venues ranging from concert halls to popular music clubs. Recent concert highlights include performances in New York, Los Angeles, and an appearance at the Deer Valley Music Festival in Park City, Utah, where they performed Rodrigo's "Concerto Andaluz" with the Utah Symphony Orchestra.

The GGQ has been featured on American Public Media's "Performance Today" and has released four critically acclaimed recordings, the most recent consisting exclusively of music composed by the Quartet.

Athens has honored the ensemble by awarding them

"Best Classical Artist" in Athens five years in a row at the Athens Flagpole Music Awards. All four members are highly experienced instructors and frequently give master classes and workshops.

Sutherland has been described as the "Dean of Guitarists" by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution.

He studied with Andres Segovia, Christopher Parkening, John Marlow, Jose Tomas and Evangelos Assimakopoulos.

Since starting the guitar program at the University of Georgia in 1971, Sutherland has been responsible for initiating numerous guitar programs throughout the state of Georgia. Sutherland has taught with Parkening in master classes at Montana State University since 1978.

Parkening has called Sutherland "one of the finest teachers in the United States."

Mountain Lions down MGC

Klammer scored for the eighth time in the last five matches as Young Harris College defeated Middle Georgia College 1-0 in a men's soccer match in Cochran on Friday.

Klammer, who was playing in just his sixth match of the season after returning from an injury, scored the lone goal of the match in the 86th minute on an assist from Ebai Ayuk. The Mountain Lions (10-3 overall) had another opportunity to score in the 63rd minute, but were unable to put away a penalty kick. Other than that, scoring opportunities were few and far between, according to Young Harris coach Mark McKeever.

"There were very few shots on either goal," McKeever said. "It was a very scrappy match, a very hard-fought match."

YHC goalkeeper Wesley Barnard recorded the

The match did not count in the regional standings. Young Harris will take a week off before returning to action against the very same Middle Georgia squad. The two teams will face each other on Saturday in Young Harris. That match will count toward the regional standings.

Hodgson shoots a 148 over 36 holes to lead YHC

ROME — Eric Hodgson fired a team-low 148 over 36 holes to lead Young Harris College at the Chick-Fil-A Collegiate Invitational, hosted by Berry College at the Coosa Country Club in Rome, Tuesday.

The Mountain Lions finished 16th in the event.

Hodgson followed his first-round 72 with a 76 over the final 18 holes. He finished in a tie for

28th overall in the tournament. Shorter College's Arvid

Bengtsson won the individual medal by shooting 72-65-

137, beating Reinhardt's Chris Cartwright by one stroke.

Young Harris' Beau Gammage finished 58th, shooting 76-78-154. Gammage was four strokes better than

YHC's Chase Hankla, who finished 78th with a score of 77-81-158, and five strokes ahead of Matt Lewallen, who shot 81-78-159 and finished 81st. Evan Jordan rounded out YHC's top five, finishing 91st with a score of 85-77-162.

The Mountain Lions' Matt Peeler played as an individual, shooting 84-85-166 and finishing 96th.

Young Harris shot 615 as a team, firing rounds of 306 and 309. Lee University won the event by

one stroke over co-runners-up Thomas University, the University of the Cumberland and William Carey University. Lee shot 576.

Young Harris returns to action Thursday when it plays for the Georgia Mountain Trophy in Clayton.
