Stray mutt climbs the ladder to federal agent

There once was a dog named Hawkeye. His origin was unknown as he wandered the streets of Blairsville. Soon he was picked up by Union County Animal Control and was later turned over the Humane Society's Mountain Shelter, Inc. He had no identification and was unclaimed by a family who apparently did not recognize their "diamond in the rough". But, the Humane Society personnel did immediately.

Arriving at the shelter on August 24, 2009 the staff made arrangements to get him to where he could put his nose to good use. On September 1, 2009 he was taken to the National Dog Detector Training Center (NDDTC) a division of the United States Department of Agriculture in Newnan, Georgia. A total of 7 dogs were taken to be evaluated, but on that fateful day Hawkeye was the "star that shined" and the only one who was accepted after passing a very stringent evaluation. And so, thus began Hawkeye's new career.

Shortly after arriving at NDDTC he was placed through a series of tests and evaluation

procedures and passed them all with flying colors. Then began his training where he would work side by side with his new handler Tino Menchaca an agricultural biologist with Santa Clara County, CA.

On December 10, 2009 Hawkeye graduated with honors and will now be serving our country proudly as a Federal Agent working to detect and intercept prohibited plant material at small parcel carriers (Fed-Ex/UPS) in San Fran-

cisco, California.

Once Hawkeye and Tino have served the US for 5 years Hawkeye will be eligible for retirement and will live happily ever after with his handler, Tino!

And the moral of the story is: The next time you plan to give away or fail to keep identification on your pet think again- he or she could be "A DIAMOND IN THE ROUGH" too!
