COMPLAINT FOR FORFEITURE  
COMES NOW THE STATE OF GEORGIA, by and through Jeffrey Langley, District Attorney for the Enotah Judicial Circuit and files this complaint for forfeiture pursuant to the Official Code of Georgia Annotated §§16-13-49(b) and 9-16-12 and shows the Court the following:

1. The property sought to be forfeited is described in the above-styled caption and is incorporated herein by reference thereto (hereinafter "the defendant property").  
2. The defendant property is presently in the custody of the Hiawassee Police Department and is located within the county, and is within the venue and subject to the jurisdiction of this Court.  
3. On September 13, 2019, the defendant, Lonnie Marcus, was operating ITEM #2 (a Harley-Davidson motorcycle) when he was stopped by the Hiawassee Police Department on North Main Street in Hiawassee, Georgia. There were no passengers on said vehicle.

4. The motorcycle was being operated with a license plate that was assigned to a different vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the motorcycle was an unregistered vehicle, having last been registered on April 4, 2017 with an expiration date of March 6, 2018. Further the defendant did not have effective insurance on ITEM #2. The stop resulted in the arrest of Lonnie Marcus for no Insurance, concealing the identity of a vehicle and operating an unregistered vehicle.

5. A search of the defendant and Item #2 resulted in the discovery of a quantity of methamphetamine and a further quantity of Alprazolam, a/k/a Xanax in the pocket of Lonnie Marcus. Item #1 (\$8,488.72 in United States Currency) was found on the person of Lonnie Marcus. Item #3 (a Ruger .38 caliber pistol) was found inside his boot. Lonnie Marcus was then arrested on the additional charges of Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Alprazolam and Possession of a firearm during the commission of a crime.  
6. As a result of the discovery of the methamphetamine and alprazolam, Item #1, Item #2 and Item #3 were seized for forfeiture.  
8. ITEM #1, ITEM #2 and ITEM #3 are contraband and subject to forfeiture to the State of Georgia pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49(b), in that the defendant Items #1, 2 and 3 were directly or indirectly used or intended for use to facilitate the Possession and/or Sale of Methamphetamine, a Schedule II controlled substance and the possession of Alprazolam, a Schedule IV controlled substance. In violation of Code Section, O.C.G.A. § 16-13-30(a) and (b) and/or is proceeds derived or realized therefrom and/or other property which is subject to forfeiture pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49.

9. Additionally, the defendant weapon(s), Item #3 (a Ruger LCR .38 caliber revolver, Serial #543-14380) is contraband and subject to forfeiture to the State of Georgia pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49(b) in that the weapon was available for use to facilitate and was within arm's reach of Lonnie Marcus while said Lonnie Marcus was committing the crime of Possession of a Controlled Substance to wit: methamphetamine, in violation of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-30 and in violation of O.C.G.A. § 16-11-106(b)(4).  
10. On September 13, 2019 Lonnie Marcus was interviewed by law enforcement officers with the Towns County Sheriffs Department and the Appalachian Regional Drug Task Force. During said interview Lonnie Marcus stated that he had additional methamphetamine at his property at 2418 Marys Way, Young Harris, Towns County, Georgia. Marcus further offered to show law enforcement where the methamphetamine was located at the address. Finally Marcus stated that he was not as "big" in selling methamphetamine as he once was and that he was trying to stop selling methamphetamine but had not stopped yet.

11. A search warrant was obtained. At the address shown above, officers found between 7 and 8 ounces of methamphetamine, an amount sufficient to constitute Trafficking in Methamphetamine in violation of O.C.G.A. 16-13-31.  
12. Item #4 (\$32,591.00 in United States currency) was found as follows: two bundles of currency were found in the seat cushions of a chair in close proximity (2-3 feet) to the methamphetamine and additional bundles of currency were found in a safe along with Marcus' birth certificate, drivers license and various vehicle titles. This safe was locate within 2-4 feet of the methamphetamine.

13. Items 5 through 33 are weapons found in close proximity to the methamphetamine.  
14. ITEM #4 is contraband and subject to forfeiture to the State of Georgia pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49(b), in that the defendant Items #4 was directly or indirectly used or intended for use to facilitate the Possession and/or Sale of Methamphetamine, a Schedule II controlled substance and the possession of Alprazolam, a Schedule IV controlled substance. In violation of Code Section, O.C.G.A. § 16-13-30(a) and (b) and/or is proceeds derived or realized therefrom and/or was found in close proximity to methamphetamine and/or other property which is subject to forfeiture pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49(b).

15. The defendant weapon(s), Item #5 through 33 is contraband and subject to forfeiture to the State of Georgia pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49(b) in that the weapons were available for use to facilitate and was within arm's reach of Lonnie Marcus while said Lonnie Marcus was committing the crime of Trafficking of a Controlled Substance to wit: Methamphetamine, in violation of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-31 and in violation of O.C.G.A. 16-11-106(b)(4) and/or are proceeds derived or realized therefrom and/or were found in close proximity to methamphetamine and/or other property which is subject to forfeiture pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 16-13-49(b).
