## Towns Co. offense explodes for 14 runs at West Hall scrimmage

### Class AAA Murray County pulls away during home opener

The Towns County Lady Indians opened the season with a scrimmage contest at West Hall on Aug. 6 before welcoming Murray County on Aug. 8.

Towns was originally slated to host West Hall for a Tuesday, Aug. 4 scrimmage but afternoon showers forced a cancellation.

Thursday's opener at West Hall was modified to a scrimmage when the Lady Spartans announced they would not play a varsity schedule this fall.

And during last week's tune-up contest, the Lady Indians overpowered the hosts with 14 runs before rain brought on another shutout in the fourth inning. Prior to the shower, Remington Parker sparked the Towns County lineup with a 2-for-4 performance, including a walk and an RBI.

In the circle, Natalie Smith worked three strong innings, surrendering one earned run with six strikeouts. Abby Mauldin tossed one shutout inning with a pair of Ks in relief.

At the dish, Mauldin was 1-for-1 with two RBIs and three walks.

Rylie Livingston added an RBI during a 1-for-2 day; Kenzie Livingston walked and drove in a run while finishing 1-for-2 at the plate.

"It doesn't go down as a win since we didn't finish five innings, but we didn't really care because we were treating it like a scrimmage, looking at kids in different spots," Towns County head coach Clay Liv-

On Saturday, Towns County hosted Class AAA Murray County, eventually falling 12-3.

Laura Mauldin turned in a 2-for-2 outing with two RBIs and a pair of walks. Parker finished 1-for-3 with a walk

and a RBI. Smith allowed five earned over four innings and Abby Mauldin gave up three runs in two innings.

Towns County is scheduled to open region play on Tuesday when they host Commerce at 5 p.m.

### "Happy" Harvick Sweeps Michigan Doubleheader

BROOKLYN, MI -- Kevin Harvick had a perfect weekend. He won both NASCAR Cup Series races this past Saturday and Sunday for his fifth and sixth wins of the season. His car was so dominant in both events that the other drivers could only hope for a runner-up finish.

He led 90 laps of Sunday's 158 lap race. The race's last caution came during lap 137. On the restart Harvick, Denny Hamlin, Martin Truex Jr., and Kyle Busch were out front. Harvick immediately put his No. 4 Ford into the lead and remained there until the checkered flag was given.

"There at the end we were tight in turns three and four," said Harvick. "It was a real challenge to hold off the 11 car (Denny Hamlin). We're proud of what we accomplished this weekend. It's a great achievement for anyone."

The win was the 55th of his Cup Series career, tying him with Rusty Wallace on the series' all-time win list.

Runner-up Denny Hamlin led one time for six laps. During the closing laps Hamlin was able to reach Harvick's rear bumper, but that was all he could manage. He was never able to attempt a pass for the lead, and was .093-seconds behind when the race ended.

"I knew we had something better, but I couldn't get into position to make a final run on him," said Hamlin. "We just got a little tight and we couldn't make the move we needed to."

Martin Truex Jr. did not lead any laps but finished third. "Our car was good, but we weren't able to do a couple things we needed," said Truex.

Kyle Busch was fourth, followed by Joey Logano, Aric Almirola, Matt DiBenedetto, Austin Dillon, Chase Elliott, and Kurt Busch.

Clint Bowyer won Stage 1, while Harvick claimed Stage 2.

Ryan Blaney was leading the race on lap 95. His teammate Brad Keselowski lost control of his car, drifted off the track into Blaney's car, sending both of them into the outside wall, and out of the race.

Blaney finished 38th and Keselowski was 39th.

"It was my fault," said Keselowski. "The back end got loose and started to come around. I just lost it and got into Ryan. I really hate it, because he didn't deserve what happened."

The victory also sealed the Michigan Heritage Trophy for Ford. The award is given to the top-performing automaker in the two annual Cup Series races at MIS.

"We are a week-to-week team. We talked about this years ago. We want to go to the track and worry about one week at a time. We want to be competitive and win as many races as we can and see where it falls in the end. These guys are awesome. A car like that is unbelievable."

Instead of reflecting on the bad wreck at Daytona which left him sidelined for three races, Ryan Newman is focusing on other possibilities.

A two-month hiatus of the 2020 season due to the Covid-19 pandemic allowed Newman time to heal and return to his No. 6 Roush Fenway Racing Ford. The battle back into contention for wins has proved even more challenging.

"No doubt I've thought about it, but the reality is it's not the truth, it's not what happened, it's the 'what could have been' and everybody has that in their season," Newman said. "We have to do our job to go back and kind of replay those events and make corrections to whatever mistakes or whatever differences we can to try to be victorious."

"That doesn't go just for Daytona; that goes for every race track. The season no doubt has been a challenge in so many ways for so many people and our team. I feel like we've struggled a little bit, but I feel like we have the things that we need to make the corrections to be better and be stronger and be successful."

NASCAR has given him a medical waiver which would allow him to use a win during the regular season to gain entry to the 16-driver playoff field despite not starting all the races.

"I guess after February I'm pretty emotional every day," he continued. "I'm just thankful for the opportunity to continue on. I get to hit the reset button in a roundabout
