Softball: Lady Indians break even vs. West Hall, Commerce

The Towns County Lady Indians split a pair of home games last week, blanking West Hall 16-0 but dropping the Region 8-A opener 16-1 to 4th-ranked Commerce.

In the win over West Hall, the Lady Indians took advantage of 13 walks and five errors to prevail 16-0 in three innings. They also received a two-hitter from Natalie Smith in the pitcher's circle.

Jayce Young scored three times while Remington Parker, Lele Moss, Abby Mauldin and Rylie Livingston each added two runs.

Moss also doubled and drove in a pair, Mauldin was 1-for-2 with two RBIs and Rylie Livingston finished 2-for-2 with two walks.

Lilly Winn, Hannah Wecer, Kenzie Livingston and Payten Calvert also tacked on a run for Towns County.

After an error scored Moss and a two-run single by Abby Mauldin made it 3-0 in the first, Smith escaped a twoon, no-out jam in the second, allowing the Lady Indians' offense to open up a 12-0 advantage after two innings.

The first pitch plunked Winn, then Parker and Moss drew a base on balls to load the bags for Rylie Livingston, who took four straight pitches for an RBI walk. Consecutive errors made it 6-0 before free passes to Kenzie Livingston and Edwards brought in the eighth and ninth runs of the game.
