The Towns County Cross Country Team traveled to Chestatee Middle School to take part in the War Eagle Invitational on Thursday, Aug. 29.

Over 30 schools were represented, spanning all of Georgia's athletic classifications 1A-7A.

The boys came away ninth out of 22 teams, while the girls finished 12th out of a 14-team field.

For the first time this year, the freshmen boys competed in the junior varsity race and raced to a 14th-Place finish out of a 20-team field.

In the JV race, Lavne Rouse led the Indians with a 22:59 20th-Place finish. The rest of the Indians' Top Five JV times were as follows: Mason Yeomans, 24:05: Curtis Markham, 26:06; Cody Ashe, 26:29; and Eli Fulford, 28:26.

The Varsity Boys were next, and running against some very good competition, they came away with a very solid Top 10 finish.

Once again, the Indians were paced by Jenson Brown, who finished 21st out of 178 runners with a time of 18:44. Rounding out the Top Five Indians were: Liam King, 20:06; Peyton Barrett, 20:16; Luis Quijada, 20:59; and Blythe Smith, 21:06.

The last race of the day was the Varsity Girls with 14 teams competing.

Leading the way for the Lady Indians was Alison Markham with a 25:25 finish. The rest of the Top Five for the Lady Indians were as follows: Jayden Taylor, 25:40; Bazya Šmith, 26:51; Gali Quijada, 29:31; and Kayla Peacock, 31:40.


Georgia Mountain Pickleball plays for Enotah CASA


