ties, the Indians were forced to punt from deep in their own end zone.

The Tigers' triple-option offense scored first after a 35-yard punt from sophomore quarterback Kyle Oakes, giving them a 7-0 lead with 8:32 left in the first quarter.

The offensive struggles continued for the Indians for the duration of the half, and the Tigers took a 44-0 lead before heading into the locker room.

But the Boys in Blue fight hard in every game, Head Coach Jason Roquemore said, and even down 44 points, they continued their fight Friday

On the opening drive of the second half, junior defensive back Garrett Oakes set the tone on defense after intercepting a Tiger pass for a 46-yard touchdown.
