Indians swat Jackets, stun No. 2 Warren County to improve to 4-4

Lady Indians win two of three with victories over Hayesville and Warren Co.

Towns County's boys went 3-0 for the week with victories over Tallulah Falls, rival Hayesville and second-ranked Warren County, running their win streak to four games.

On Tuesday the boys defeated Tallulah Falls in an overtime thriller. Towns won the game by a score of 76-72. The Indians lost by 2 points earlier in the season at Tallulah and were able to take revenge on their home court.

Tucker Engert led the Indians in scoring with 37 points, 3 assists and 3 steals. Dustin Barrett had 16 points, 7 rebounds and 3 steals. Cruz Kitchens added 14 points, 7 rebounds and 1 steal. Jonas Rouse pitched in 7 points, 6 rebounds, and 6 assists. Mason Pierson added 3 points and 4

On Friday, Dec. 6, Towns County welcomed rival Hayesville, NC to Hiawassee for a much anticipated matchup. Towns jumped on Hayesville early and led by 20+ points for most of the game. The Indians were able to hold the Yellow Jackets at bay for the 2nd half and cruise to a 67-51 victory.

Kitchens led the Indians in scoring with 17 points and 5 rebounds. Barrett scored 15 points, made 9 rebounds, and had 2 steals. Engert had 13 points, 5 assists, and 3 steals. 
