YOUNG HARRIS -For over 40 years, Mountain Regional Library has been providing quality library services to the citizens of both Towns and Union counties. However, the financial commitment of operating two branches in Towns County can no longer be met.

Due to this unfortunate circumstance, the Mountain Regional Library branch of the Mountain Regional Library System has had to close temporarily, ceasing all in-person services effective

Administrative functions

performed at Mountain Regional Library will continue as normal.

Mountain Regional Library is located equidistant between Blairsville and Hiawassee, making it easily accessible for anyone located in the area or traveling between the two towns.

The Young Harris library also serves as the headquarters location for the Mountain Regional Library System, which includes Fannin County Public Library as well.

Lack of in-person services at Mountain Regional Library does not mean library services will be unavailable for
