Ninth-ranked Indians get hard fought win over No. 10 Social Circle

It had been 15 days since the Towns County Indians varsity basketball team had faced an opponent until last Saturday night due to Covid issues at other schools resulting in cancellations or rescheduling of four games when they played host to the undefeated, 10th-ranked Social Circle Redskins as their first Region 8-A Public opponent of the year.

The Indians led the entire game with the exception of a scoreless tie for a minute and seven seconds at the start of the game and a 44-44 standoff for fifteen seconds early in the third quarter in taking a 64-58

The fact that the Indians led for all but a total of less than a minute and a half might lead one to believe it was an easy victory for the Indians but that was not the case. The Indians did appear

on several occasions to be taking control of the game only to have the Redskins rally to within striking distance and the single tie but the Indians had an answer themselves each time Social Circle reduced their lead. Examples of Indian leads were by a 12-2 score in the first quarter, 21-12 in the second, 33-24 and 40-28 in the third, and 62-53 and 64-55 late in the fourth quarter with a three point Redskins bank shot with eleven seconds left closing the gap to 64-58 at the end. The Redskins entered

the game with a 4-0 record and it is often interesting to examine how a team reached their record. This exploration turned out to be especially impressive when learning that Class A Social Circle got their four wins against larger classification schools with one victory coming against a Class 2A school, two against 5A schools, and the other against a 6A school. But the Redskins struck for thirteen points the remainder of the quarter interrupted this time by just a pair of free throws by senior Kabe Ellis for a razor thin 42-41 Towns lead entering the fourth quarter.

A drive to the basket for two points by senior Aidan Berrong got the Indians a 44-41 lead at the 7:35 mark of the fourth quarter but the Redskins struck for a trey for the aforementioned brief tie of 44-44 at the 6:48 mark.

A runner by Moss got the Indians a lead of 46-44 they would not relinquish at the 6:33 mark, however, with the Indians reversing the pattern of the first three quarters by finishing on an upswing for the 64-58 victory although it would not be until the final minute of the game that the Indians would secure a safe
