Lakeview rallies for walk-off victory despite DeVries' efforts

Gainesville - The Indians gave up two in the bottom of the seventh in a 2-1 loss to Lakeview Academy (4-14, 1-9) despite out-hitting the Lions 4-to-3 and five errors from the Lakeview defense.

Towns County (4-13, 2-6) got its run in the fourth when junior Adam Barrett reached on an error and advanced to third on a passed ball. He would score off the bat of Isaiah Shook, who also reached on an error.

A leadoff triple by Lakeview in the seventh immediately put the home team in business. Junior Will DeVries would record a strikeout for the first out but not after the Lions tied the game 1-1 on a passed ball.

An Indians' error and a sacrifice put the winning run in scoring position with two outs when a single to left scored the game-winner.

DeVries, who pitched well enough to win, went the distance, fanning five while yielding a pair of unearned runs, three hits, and one walk. In 6 2/3 innings, DeVries showed spin-point control, throwing 88 pitches - 61 for strikes. At the plate he went 2-for-3.

Junior Major Moss finished 1-for-4 with a stolen base and sophomore Zach Davenport was 1-for-3. Junior Jackson Taylor and sophomore Dalton Key each drew a walk while junior Kobe Denton stole two bases, and Barrett scored the only Towns County run of the

The Indians will be back in action on Friday when they host a doubleheader with Prince Avenue beginning at 4 p.m. Prince is currently 11-7 overall and 5-3 in Region 8-A - good enough for third place, one game ahead of fourth place Providence Christian, who is 5-5 in 8-A play.

Towns trails the final playoff spot by just one game in the loss column and the Indians and Providence split their two games earlier in the season. George Walton and Hebron remain unbeaten in region-play.

Soccer: Hebron Christian takes two from Towns County

Both teams off this week and look to get back on track during the break

Last week Towns County soccer was scheduled to host a pair of Region 8-A matchups with playoff implications on the line in both contests.

Unfortunately, Tuesday's meeting with Hebron Christian Academy didn't go as planned and Thursday's game was postponed. With a State playoff spot within reach, the Lady Indians (5-3, 2-3) suffered a 1-0 loss at the hands of Hebron Christian.

Later, Towns County's men (1-6, 1-4) were unable to pick up their second region-win of the season after coming out on the wrong end of an 8-1 loss.

The Lady Indians are currently tied for third in 8-A with Providence, who was supposed to visit Hiwassee on Thursday. Towns remains in excellent shape for a State Tournament-bid, especially with a week for Coach John Cornett and his squad to seek improvements before the final

three region games. Hebron is second in 8-A with two losses and split with the Lady Indians this season. Lakeview is in first at 5-0.

Towns' men could still reach third place with a win over Providence, when the teams makeup last week's contest.

The next game for Towns is on Apr. 11th when they travel to Highlands, NC, for a non-region affair to knock off some of the rust that may have accumulated over the break.

Justin Gonyea awarded USCAA Student Athlete of the Year

Justin Gonyea of Warne, NC was Team Captain of the 2015-2016 Warren-Wilson College Owls.

Justin and the #4 seeded Owls finished in the final four of the USCAA National Championships in Union Town, PA on March 4th. The Owls faced #1 seed Berkeley College from New York City in the semi-finals and failed to make the National Championship Game. This is the fourth trip to Nationals for the Owls, winning the Championship in 2013, Justin's freshman year.

The Owls are 6-4 in tournament play in four years at the National Championship. Justin is the first player for Warren-Wilson to start in all 10 National Tournament games. His senior season including tournament play Justin averaged 15.8 points per game, shot 46.3% from the field, 44.1% from the three point line and was a 84.9% free throw shooter. Justin's career scoring total is 1,481 points, 229 three point shots made, 392 rebounds, 170 steals and 282 assists.

This year Justin ranked 3rd in the USCAA DII in

three point percentage and also ranked 3rd in free throw percentage at the finish of the season. Justin led the Owls in scoring his sophomore and senior year, his junior and senior seasons earned him a spot as a USCAA All-American and in 2014 Justin was the three point contest Champion during tournament week.

This year at the USCAA Annual Banquet held at Nemaocolin Woodlands Resort in Union Town, PA, Justin was recognized as The USCAA Student Athlete of the Year which is the first time any athlete has received this honor in Warren-Wilson College history. NT(Apr6,24)CA
