## Towns Basketball goes undefeated in games last week

The Towns County High School Indians and Lady Indians saw great success last week, going undefeated on the court.

On Wednesday, Jan. 11, in a girls-only away game against Summit Charter High School, the ladies finished the evening with a whopping 65-26 victory.

Top performers were sophomore Kaleigh Beaver with 18 points and senior Sarah Shook with 17.

Then on Saturday, Jan. 15, away at Washington-Wilkes High School, Towns County's girls picked up another solid win, scoring 53-26.

Top performers were junior Brelan Sieveking with 14 points, 7 steals and 5 assists; sophomore Kaleigh Beaver with 14 points and 11 rebounds – a double-double; and Shook with nine points, 6 rebounds, 3 steals and 3 assists.

"Our defense has been great," Girls Head Coach Shea Taylor said. "We are turning opponents over, but we still need to do a better job of limiting our turnovers."

"Our guards Sieveking, Shook, and (senior) Tabitha Barnes are bringing intensity to our press; and our post players (junior) Laura Mauldin, Beaver, and (junior) Emma Lallement are continuing to dominate the boards."

"We are going into a big week as we play three region games starting Tuesday with Greene County, and we are fighting for the highest seed we can get in the Region Tournament."

"We are improving every week and are going to keep working. (We are) 4-0 in

region and hope to stay undefeated in region play."

Next, the Indians went on to topple their task as well by defeating Wilkes 51-47, with top performances by juniors Zane Floyd, who was the lead scorer with 20 points, and Gage Rogers hooping up 11.

"(Our boys) led the entire game," Indians Head Coach Brian Hunnicutt said. "Wilkes was able to tie the game up late in the third

quarter but could never take the lead; and with that, we moved to 5-2 in the region, and in Second Place.

"I am so proud of the boys; it was a gutsy win in a hostile environment. We played well and were able to get back on the right track. Now we play a tough Greene County team at home on Tuesday (and will be looking for) another region victory."

After press time on Tuesday, Jan. 17, Towns County will host Greene County, with JV action beginning at 4:30 p.m. and Varsity at 6 p.m.

Then on Friday, Jan. 20, another set of away games will take place at Lincoln County with JV set to start at 4 p.m. and Varsity at 7 p.m.

On Saturday, Jan. 21, Towns Basketball will make up a pair of games that were canceled last week due to inclement weather conditions. The Indians will face Lake Oconee Academy at home, with JV tipping off at 3:30 p.m. and Varsity games starting with the girls at 5 p.m. Go Indians!
