The Towns County Indians mens' soccer team won their first-round matchup against Elite Scholars Academy by a final score of 4-3 last Friday, April 18.

It was a nail-biter. Considering Towns County's offense had been struggling lately, the high-scoring outing was a much-needed turnaround.

They hit Elite Scholars Academy with a three-pronged attack, as the team got scores from Tucker Engert with twogoals, Connor Williams and Cruz Kitchens. The team has won nine of their last 10 matches. Their season record comes in at 17 - 2.

Towns County travels to Chattahoochee County on Wednesday, April 30 looking to punch a ticket to the Elite Eight. The winner either visits to Metter or hosts Irwin County on Tuesday, May 6.

The Lady Indians squared off in some playoff action on Tuesday, April 22, but Towns County had to settle for a loss. In their last match
