#### Riley wins Smokey Bear Award for fire prevention efforts

Local fire prevention advocate Frank Riley is one of only two people in the nation to win a 2021 Silver Smokey Bear Award by the U.S. Forest Service, and he is "blown away" by the honor.

Since 1957, the prestigious Smokey Bear Award Program has recognized organizations and individuals for outstanding service in wildfire prevention at the national, multistate, and statewide levels, or gold, silver and bronze respectively, per the Forest No one received a na-

tional gold award in 2021, and three people got bronze awards this year. The awards are sponsored by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service, the National Association of State Foresters and the Ad These Smokey Bear

Award winners are being honored for the dedication, innovation and energy they bring to wildfire prevention," USDA Forest Service Chief Vicki an incredible honor for Riley,

Christiansen said. "Throughout the many years of these awards, it's people like these who show up with the passion and desire to make a differ-

Riley is the executive director of the Chestatee-Chattahoochee Resource Conservation and Development Council, which provides educational and other resources to farmers and students in 13 Northeast Georgia counties, including Union and Towns.

He is also the state liaison for Firewise USA covering all of Georgia; the founder of the Appalachian RC&D Fire Adapted Communities Coalition, comprising 63 counties between Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia; and immediate past chair of the Georgia Prescribed Fire Council.

Locally, Riley is a volunteer firefighter for the Towns County Fire Department, and he spearheaded the Firewise program in North Georgia following an 800-acre wildfire

Although Riley may be the leader in the endeavors that won him the award, he credits his team with the successes that led to him receiving it, including his Chest-Chatt RC&D Executive Assistant Kim Mc-Collum, the other RC&Ds in the Appalachian coalition, and the many community partners who have made Firewise and

other initiatives possible.
