The Chatuge Shores Ladies Golf Association (CS-LGA) played a Stableford event on Tuesday, June 8. First developed by Dr. Frank Stableford (1870-1959) and used in competition for the first time in 1932, the objective of the Stableford scoring system is to accumulate the most points over 18 holes of golf. Each player receives points according to how she scores in relation to par. The scoring system gives more points for being below par and less points for over par scores. Its theory is that players should earn points for good shots rather than counting all strokes on a hole.

For the ladies of CS-LGA, we left the details to our Tuesday Chair, Mary Mott, who calculated the winners for us using the USGA online scoring system.
