# Soccer: 2021 Indians added to Blitz HOF

The Towns County High School men's soccer team added another accolade to its historic 2021 campaign with its recent induction into the Blitz Sports Hall of Fame.

Much of the Indians' recent success came courtesy of a deep senior class that played an integral role in the program's rise to prominence under head coach Rollie Thomas. The season culminated with a region title, followed by the program's first final four appearance.

The team's Hall of Fame web page reads, "COACH: Rollie Thomas.

"RECORD: 11-3; AC-COMPLISHMENTS: Region 8-A Championship, No. 2 State Ranking, Class 1A Final Four.

"The team was incredibly talented, and it all started with Peyton Barrett and Jensen Brown, who were undisputed leaders and the best players in the region. "The season ended in

a loss to the eventual state champs in the semifinals at home in Hiawassee, and came with a #2 state ranking. For the Indians, it was only the secondever playoff run, and far and away the greatest season in school history. This was a close call, as we could easily seeing going with Jefferson as well.'
