Football: Indians miss program-record winning streak in loss at Lincoln

Lincolnton - Standout running back Kyle Oakes accounted for both Towns County touchdowns, but it wasn't enough as the Indians were unable to match the 2008 team's programbest four-game winning streak.

The 4-2 Red Devils picked up their first region win of the year behind 192 yards rushing and three scores from Tevin Gartrell, who was named Homecoming King before kickoff. Oakes impressed as well, toting the rock 27 times for 124 yards.

Lincoln jumped out to a 20-0 advantage before Oakes blasted his away into the endzone from the 2-yard line with 4:23 left in the half. Lincoln added a 30yard field goal at the 1:30 mark, taking a 23-6 lead into the break after a Towns drive stalled in the red zone.

Oakes scored from seven yards out early in the third but the Lincoln offense continued rolling, answering with consecutive scores to build a 37-12 margin with 11:14 remaining.
