## Commissioner adopts amended Joint Comprehensive Plan

A 10-Year Joint Compre-
hensive Plan for Towns County
and the cities of Hiawassee and
Young Harris has been in place
for many years, with local of-
ficials attempting on a recur-
ring basis to clarify and direct
the development goals of these
communities over time.
In Georgia, cities and
counties must maintain planning
documents to "retain eligibiility
for various funding, permitting
and incentive programs admin-
istered by the state," according
to the Georgia Department of
Community Affairs, or DCA.
The DCA requires such
documents to be updated every
five years for municipapilities
that do not collect impact fees,
which are designed to defray
